

If she behaves true to form, she will pick up the sound of the car engine well before we reach the house, and once she has knocked me over with her welcome she will dance round the garden in sheer delight.

It's a privilege of my job to remember other people's joys as well as my own during the past year: the couples I have married, the children I have baptised. 

Christians believe that love is at the heart of God's will for our lives – love for God and love for others.

Jesus was once asked to name the greatest commandment. His reply - known as the 'Summary of the Law' - was this:

The first commandment is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is the only Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.'

The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

Loving God and loving your neighbour belong together, and the best, most fruitful life is lived in loving communion with God our Creator, as well as with our fellow human beings.

Our lives need to be shaped in a rhythm of worship and service: love for God and love for others.

Taizé prayer is the creation of a monastic community in Taizé, France, founded in the 1940s by a Swiss man known as Brother Roger Brother Roger was especially interested in bringing Catholics and Protestants together.

"It is a time to rest in God, to let the words listened to and sung penetrate one's being." So, says Brother John, a Taizé monk, in lectures and writings explaining what the service is all about.

There is no preaching, no teaching, no talk of sin or repentance or forgiveness. There is just this elegantly simple service: short chants, often in Latin, repeated over and over in the candlelight. Plus, some short Scripture readings or psalms, accompanied by candles and short periods of silent pray, where we lift our hearts and innermost thoughts and praises to God.

All Saints Cottage Repairs 2018




The Repairs to the cottage roof have now been completed. The repairs were funded entirely by part of the Legacy left by Jack and Iris Myers to All Saints Church in their will.

The rather inclement weather at the beginning of the building works slowed the initial progress, but repairs have been finished on time. The roof was completely stripped down, re-sloped and repaired with high quality roofing materials. It is hoped that the new roof will prevent any further leaking and damage to the internal walls and ceilings of the cottage. The building company, Jesus Carmelo Anceume builders, have provided a very professional service.

A Plaque remembering Jack & Iris´s generosity to All Saints will be placed on the cottage wall.

<u>Candlemas will be celebrated on February 3RD</u> <u>Come and join us in Chris</u>tian Fellowship



What is Candlemas and what are its origins?

Candlemas, before it was converted to a Christian festival, was originally a pagan festival of light as it fell exactly midway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox. It is held in February to commemorate the purification of the Virgin Mary (after childbirth, according to Jewish law) and the presentation of Christ in the Temple, although originally it was also the time when the years' supply of candles were blessed.

Simeon called Jesus "a light to enlighten the Gentiles." Accordingly, this day was made into Candlemas, a feast of candles. The warm candlelight is meant to be a tangible reminder of that greater light which, for and beyond all time, radiates from the figure of Jesus. We are reminded of the need to be prepared to burn brightly ourselves in the midst of this dark world. We take a light away this morning, it is not our own light, no light of our own would be bright enough, rather it is the light of Christ. The light which at the beginning of creation shined in the darkness and which no darkness could overcome. Jesus was a light to lighten the gentiles, all the nations and races and culture of people.

Prune and Plant : Dorothy Charnock - Three decades dedicated to All Saints gardens





It is impossible to do justice to the years of tireless dedication Dorothy has spent in the gardens of All Saints in a few short paragraphs. Having spent 32 years in Tenerife volunteering at All Saints, Dorothy has weeded, pruned and planted more plants than any of us could dare to imagine. She remembers her early gardening days in All Saints. She was approached by the Chaplain's wife, Mabel, and asked if she would like to help as she was one of the younger members of the congregation. Together they dug out all the plumbago plants and their enormous roots in front of the parsonage. After a week of digging they finished in a trench so deep the Chaplain asked if they were trying to reach Australia!

Dorothy is also a keen animal lover, her first love being horses, which she kept in England. She volunteered at an animal shelter in Puerto for many years and is a true lover of all God's creatures. Our current Chaplain Paula has been the grateful recipient of one of Dorothy's little charges, a stray Siamese cat, called Bonnie. She is a delight to us all and an excellent lizard catcher! (The cat not the Chaplain).

It is thanks to all our volunteer gardeners like Dorothy, who dedicate so much time and effort in tending All Saints gardens that we are all able to enjoy a little piece of God's Paradise here on earth.

All Saints Charitable Giving 2018/2019

All Saints will continue donating to the charities it assisted in 2018 with the help of all our wonderful parishioners and supporters. These are the following charities we have all assisted in 2018:

The Holy Franciscan brothers of <u>La Cruz Blanca</u>. The Franciscan brothers care for elderly and/or disabled men who are homeless, of reduced means or those unable to care for themselves, providing them with a kind and stable home in a residential care setting. Apart from our donation of 500€, the Harvest Festival food collection for 2018 was shared between the Red Cross (Cruz Roja) and the White Cross (Cruz Blanca).

Centro Educativo Madre Matilde Téllez. This day centre for children between the ages of 4-17, is based in Puerto de la Cruz. It is run by the holy order of Hijas de María Inmaculada and was re-opened in 2016 to help children at risk of marginalization, poverty and social exclusion. It is an honour for all of us at All Saints to support the amazing work done by these wonderful ladies, who offer educational support, social skills and pastoral care to the children. All Saints parishioners and supporters donated 500€ to this worthy cause.

<u>The British Legion.</u> Once again there was an exceptional turn out by All Saints parishioners and supporters for the Remembrance Day Service. A special mention must be made to the ladies in the All Saints Sewing Circle. Their splendid knitted poppy cascade added a special touch to the moving service delivered by the Revd. Dr. Paula Clifford. The Service Collection raised 605€ for The Legion.

<u>The Red Cross</u> Parishioners and supporters of the Red Cross, La Cruz Roja, donate weekly food supplies for those in need. A wicker basket inside the church is there for this purpose. We thank all of those who contribute food stuffs to this cause. All Saints also donated 300€ to the Red Cross as part of its annual Charitable giving.

<u>Christian Aid.</u> 2018 saw the beginning of All Saints move towards a more outward looking vision of Christian charitable giving. Whilst we are aware of the needs of the many charities in the Canary Islands, we believe that it is our duty as Christians to consider the needs of people all around the World. Christian Aid aims to expose Worldwide poverty. All Saints parishioners and supporters donated 500€ to Christian Aid in 2018.

The Chaplaincy Council is committed to increasing charitable donations in 2019. Special Services will be held during the year, and collections will be made to mark Special Events, World Emergency Giving and particular Charity Giving Days.
